Summary (as of Jul 22, 2002)

Disapproves the extension with respect to Vietnam of the President's authority under the Trade Act of 1974 to waive freedom of emigration requirements to make a nonmarket economy country eligible for normal trade relations, programs of credits, credit guarantees, or investment guarantees, and commercial agreements.

Actions Timeline

Res. 101; that the joint resolution be considered as read; that all points of order against the joint resolution be waived; that the joint resolution be debatable for one hour, equally divided and controlled; and that the previous question be considered as ordered to final passage without intervening motion.
- **Jul 23, 2002:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H.J. Res. 101.
- **Jul 23, 2002:** The previous question was ordered pursuant to a previous order of the House.
- **Jul 23, 2002:** POSTPONED ROLL CALL VOTE - At the conclusion of debate on the joint resolution, the Chair put the question on passage and by voice vote, announced that the noes had prevailed. The Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered and the Chair postponed the roll call until later in the legislative day.
