HMO Solvency Act of 2001 - Amends title XIX (Medicaid) of the Social Security Act (SSA) to establish solvency-related requirements for Medicaid managed care organizations, requirements that include periodic financial reporting to the State, independent audits, and approval of certain subcontractors.

Amends part C (Medicare+Choice) of SSA title XVIII (Medicare) to establish solvency-related requirements for application to Medicare+Choice organizations.

Directs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to provide for the application of such requirements to organizations other than Medicare+Choice organizations that receive payment on a capitated basis for provision of Medicare services.

### **Actions Timeline**

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- **Feb 7, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
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- **Jan 3, 2001:** Introduced in House
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- **Jan 3, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
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
