Summary (as of Dec 20, 2001)

Amends the Internal Revenue Code to provide that, in the case of an individual, there shall be allowed a limited tax credit (up to \$2,000 a dwelling) for qualified energy efficiency home improvements.

Provides, for a business, a limited (up to \$2,000 a dwelling) new energy efficient home credit for energy efficient property installed during the construction of a home.
