Revises the boundaries of the George Washington Birthplace National Monument to include specified lands which the Secretary of the Interior: (1) may acquire, with the owner's consent; and (2) shall administer in accordance with the laws generally applicable to such National Monument and units of the National Park System.

Authorizes appropriations.
