School and Day-Care Lead-Based Paint Reduction Act of 2001 - Authorizes the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to make matching grants to States, local governments, and local educational agencies to evaluate and reduce lead-based paint hazards at public elementary schools and licensed child day-care facilities.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 10, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Education Reform.
- **Jun 8, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment and Hazardous Materials.
- **May 25, 2001:** Introduced in House
- **May 25, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
