### Summary (as of Jan 3, 2001)

Minimum Wage Act of 2001 - Amends the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to increase the Federal minimum wage (currently \$5.15 per hour) to: (1) \$5.65 per hour during the year beginning July 1, 2001; and (2) \$6.15 per hour beginning July 1, 2002.
