Medicare Rural Ambulance Service Equity Act of 2001 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act, as amended by the Medicare, Medicaid, and SCHIP Benefits Improvement and Protection Act of 2000, to direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to provide for a 20 percent increase in payment made under the Medicare program for ambulance services furnished to Medicare beneficiaries in rural areas.
