To amend the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to increase the Federal minimum wage by \$1.62 over 3 years.

### Summary (as of Jun 28, 2001)

Amends the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 to increase the Federal minimum wage (currently \$5.15 per hour) to: (1) \$5.65 per hour beginning on the effective date of this Act; (2) \$6.15 per hour beginning one year after the effective date of this Act; and (3) \$6.77 per hour beginning two years after the effective date of this Act.
