Summary (as of Jul 18, 2001)

Medicare Equity and Access Act of 2001 - Amends part C (Medicare+Choice) of title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to provide for: (1) elimination of reduction in Medicare+Choice payment rates by neutrality adjustments; and (2) an increase in the baseline of the national per capita Medicare+Choice growth percentage for years after 2001.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 31, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
- **Jul 31, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 18, 2001:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 18, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
