Summary (as of Oct 11, 2001)

Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to: (1) exclude portable electrocardiograms, portable x-rays, and portable mammograms from payment under the skilled nursing facility prospective payment system; and (2) include as reasonable and necessary for Medicare reimbursement the costs of transportation of electrocardiogram equipment.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 31, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Oct 29, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
- **Oct 11, 2001:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 11, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
