- Dec 13, 2001: POSTPONED ROLL CALL VOTE At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 314, the Chair put the question on adoption of the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mr. Diaz-Balart objected to the voice vote based upon the absence of a quorum and pursuant to the rule, the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question until later in the legislative day. The point of no quorum was considered as withdrawn.
