Summary (as of Oct 30, 2001)

Trooper Timothy Mossbruker Memorial Act - Amends Chapter 53 (Machine Guns, Destructive Devices, and Certain Other Firearms) of the Internal Revenue Code to include in the definition of the term "firearm" (for purposes of the National Firearms Act) a 50 caliber sniper weapon.

Amends the Brady Handgun Violence Prevention Act to prohibit the transfer or possession of a 50 caliber sniper weapon.
