Nursing Shortage State Response Act of 2001 - States that nothing in the Social Security Act shall prevent a State from creating new positions and categories of nursing assistants and from permitting Medicare and Medicaid payment for them if the assistants hired are doing tasks that would be Medicare/Medicaid funded if performed by a nurse.
