Sets forth the rule (open) for the consideration of H.R. 3994 (Afghanistan freedom support).

Actions Timeline

- **May 15, 2002:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 107-463, by Mr. Diaz-Balart.
- **May 15, 2002:** It shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on International Relations now printed in the bill.
- **May 15, 2002:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 156.
- **May 15, 2002:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2480-2482)
- **May 15, 2002:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 419.
- **May 15, 2002:** The previous question was ordered without objection.
- **May 15, 2002:** POSTPONED ROLLCALL VOTE - At the conclusion of debate the Chair put the question on the adoption of the resolution and by voice vote announced that they ayes had prevailed. Mr. Hastings (FL) demanded the Yeas and Nays and pursuant to the rule the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of the resolution until later in the legislative day.
- **May 15, 2002:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H2482-2483)
- **May 15, 2002:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 415 - 0 (Roll no. 162).(text: CR H2480)
