### Summary (as of May 15, 2002)

Waives the requirement under rule XIII of the House of Representatives of a two-thirds vote to consider a Committee on Rules report on the same day it is presented to the House, with respect to any resolution reported by such Committee on May 15, 2002, providing for consideration or disposition of a bill to reauthorize and improve the program of block grants to States for temporary assistance for needy families, and improve access to quality child care.

## **Actions Timeline**

- **May 15, 2002:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 107-464, by Ms. Pryce (OH).
- **May 15, 2002:** The requirement of clause 6(a) of rule XIII for a two-thirds vote to consider a report from the Committee on Rules on the same day it is reported is waived.
- **May 15, 2002:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 157.
- **May 15, 2002:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H2484-2491)
- **May 15, 2002:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 420.
- **May 15, 2002:** The previous question was ordered without objection.
- **May 15, 2002:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 219 - 200 (Roll no. 164).(text: CR H2484)
- **May 15, 2002:** On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 219 - 200 (Roll no. 164). (text: CR H2484)
- **May 15, 2002:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
