Summary (as of Jun 6, 2002)

Veterans Medicare Reimbursement Act of 2002 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act (SSA) to require the Secretaries of Health and Human Services (HHS) and of Veterans Affairs (VA) to establish a Medicare subvention project under which the HHS Secretary shall reimburse the VA Secretary for Medicare health care services furnished to Medicare-eligible veterans in VA facilities.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 2, 2002:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 26, 2002:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
- **Jun 11, 2002:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jun 6, 2002:** Introduced in House
