Summary (as of Mar 15, 2001)

Mercury-Safe Seafood Act of 2001 - Directs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to establish a tolerance and sampling system, and related public education and health advisory system, respecting the presence of methylmercury in seafood.

Deems as unsafe any seafood not meeting such tolerance.
