Summary (as of Oct 10, 2002)

Private Party Judicial Fairness Act of 2002 - Amends the Federal judicial code to provide that interest on a claim against the United States shall be allowed in a judgment of the United States Court of Federal Claims from the date the suit was filed. (Currently, such interest is allowed only as expressly provided under a contract or Act of Congress.)

- **Nov 12, 2002:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration, Border Security, and Claims.
- **Oct 11, 2002:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E1816)
- **Oct 10, 2002:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 10, 2002:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
