Summary (as of Mar 1, 2001)

District of Columbia Retrocession Act - Cedes the District of Columbia to Maryland after Maryland's acceptance of such retrocession. Maintains the exclusive legislative authority and control of Congress over the National Capital Service Area in the District of Columbia.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 9, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution.
- **Mar 8, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on District of Columbia.
- **Mar 1, 2001:** Introduced in House
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- **Mar 1, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
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
