Summary (as of Mar 13, 2001)

Provides for Federal acquisition of: (1) certain real property owned by Environmental Land Technology, Ltd. (ELT), within the Red Cliffs Reserve in Washington County, Utah; and (2) certain ELT land adjacent to the land within the Reserve but landlocked as a result of the Reserve's creation.

Provides for just compensation to owners of real property taken pursuant to this Act.
