Low Income Energy Reinvestment Act - Amends the Mineral Leasing Act to earmark for implementation of the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Act of 1981 five percent of monies generated from sales, bonuses, royalties, and rentals of public lands (onshore Federal oil and natural gas revenues).

- **Apr 30, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Education Reform.
- **Mar 20, 2001:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Energy and Air Quality, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.

- **Mar 16, 2001:** Executive Comment Requested from Interior.
- **Mar 8, 2001:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 8, 2001:** Referred to the Committee on Resources, and in addition to the Committees on Education and the Workforce, and Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
