### Summary (as of Mar 13, 2001)

Appropriates specified funds to the Radiation Exposure Compensation Trust Fund for payments to eligible beneficiaries under the Radiation Exposure Compensation Act.

Requires such appropriation to be designated by the President's official budget and by Congress as an emergency requirement for purposes of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Act).
