Product Safety Notification and Recall Effectiveness Act of 2003 - Instructs the Consumer Product Safety Commission to promulgate a consumer product safety standard that requires the manufacturer of a covered consumer product to establish and maintain a consumer notification system for product recalls.

Prescribes database requirements.
