Summary (as of Mar 26, 2003)

Security Against Nuclear Enemies Act of 2003 - Requires the Secretary of Defense to direct the Director of the Missile Defense Agency, as soon as technologically possible, to design and deploy a land- and sea-based national missile defense system capable of defending the national territory of the United States against ballistic missile attack.
