### Summary (as of Jan 7, 2003)

United States Library Trust Fund Act - Amends the Internal Revenue Code to: (1) establish in the Treasury the United States Library Trust Fund; and (2) permit a taxpayer to designate one dollar of any tax overpayment of tax and any cash contribution which the taxpayer includes with a return to such Fund. Provides for grants from such fund to public libraries and public school libraries.

### Actions Timeline

- **Feb 21, 2003:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Select Education.
- **Jan 7, 2003:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 7, 2003:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
