Summary (as of May 20, 2003)

Coastal and Historic Communities Protection Act of 2003 - Prohibits the Secretary of Transportation from providing funds to study, design, engineer, or construct a second set of rail tracks (double tracking) on the Pacific Surfliner corridor through the Orange County, California, coastal and historic cities of Dana Point, San Juan Capistrano, and San Clemente.
