- **May 13, 2003:** Mr. Burgess moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.

- **May 13, 2003:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 222.
- **May 13, 2003:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
