Summary (as of Sep 10, 2003)

Homestead Preservation Act - Directs the Secretary of Labor to establish a program of low-interest loan (residential) mortgage assistance to eligible persons who are separated from their employment.

Limits assistance to 12 months, and requires repayment within five years.
