(This measure has not been amended since it was passed by the House on November 5, 2003. The summary of that version is repeated here.)

Reauthorizes the ban on undetectable firearms for another ten years under the Undetectable Firearms Act of 1988 (which makes it illegal to manufacture, import, possess, or transfer a firearm that is not detectable by walk-through metal detectors or airport x-ray machines).
