(This measure has not been amended since it was reported to the Senate on March 19, 2003. The summary of that version is repeated here.)

Rim of the Valley Corridor Study Act - Directs the Secretaries of the Interior and Agriculture to conduct a joint resources study of the area comprising the Rim of the Valley Corridor in Southern California to evaluate a range of alternatives for protecting resources, including the suitability and feasibility of establishing the area as a unit of the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area.

Authorizes appropriations.
