Summary (as of Nov 21, 2003)

Office of Ocean and Coastal Policy Creation Act of 2003 - Establishes in the Executive Office of the President an Office of Oceans and Coastal Policy to: (1) develop comprehensive oceans and coastal policy; and (2) advise the President on scientific, environmental, economic, technological, and international considerations involved in areas of national concern to oceans and coastal policy, including the sustainable use of resources.

Requires the President to establish a Commission on Ocean and Coastal Policy to advise and assist the presidentially appointed Director of the Office.

- **Dec 8, 2003:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment, Technology, and Standards.
- **Dec 4, 2003:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Fisheries Conservation, Wildlife and Oceans.
- **Nov 23, 2003:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E2423-2424)
- **Nov 21, 2003:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 21, 2003:** Referred to the Committee on Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Science, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
