**(This measure has not been amended since it was reported to the Senate on August 26, 2003. The summary of that version is repeated here.)**

Directs the Secretary of the Interior to conduct and submit to specified congressional committees a National Historic Landmark theme study to identify sites and resources in the United States that are significant to the Cold War, including recommendations for commemorating and interpreting such sites and cost estimates.

Requires the Secretary to prepare and publish an interpretive handbook on the Cold War and to disseminate information gathered through the study through means in addition to the handbook.

Authorizes appropriations.
