Summary (as of Jul 22, 2004)

Military Families Bereavement Leave Act - Amends the Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA) to authorize leave for immediate family members of a member of the uniformed services who dies in the line of duty, in order to facilitate their attendance at the burial ceremony.

Makes eligible for such leave those immediate family members who are FMLA-eligible employees. Treats Federal officers and Federal employees as FMLA-eligible employees for purposes of such leave.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 7, 2004:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Workforce Protections.
- **Aug 16, 2004:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Civil Service and Agency Organization.
- **Jul 22, 2004:** Introduced in House
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- **Jul 22, 2004:** Referred to the Committee on Education and the Workforce, and in addition to the Committees on Government Reform, and House Administration, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
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
