Nursing Home Fire Safety Act of 2004 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) and XIX (Medicaid) of the Social Security Act to require automatic fire sprinkler systems in all Medicare and Medicaid funded nursing facilities and provide for reimbursement of the additional costs incurred with respect to installing such systems.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 4, 2004:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jul 22, 2004:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 22, 2004:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR E1495-1496)
- **Jul 22, 2004:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 22, 2004:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
