Declares that the House of Representatives: (1) supports the goals and ideals of Peace Officers Memorial Day to honor Federal, State, and local peace officers killed or disabled in the line of duty; and (2) calls upon the people of the United States to observe such a day with appropriate ceremonies and respect.

Actions Timeline

- May 11, 2004: Mrs. Miller (MI) moved to suspend the rules and agree to the resolution.
- May 11, 2004: Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H2751-2752)
- May 11, 2004: DEBATE The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H. Res. 622.
- May 11, 2004: At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- May 11, 2004: Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H2775)
