Summary (as of Mar 3, 2005)

Medicare Mental Health Copayment Equity Act of 2005 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to provide, by a gradual increase in the percentage of expenses considered incurred expenses, for a gradual reduction (from 50% to the standard 20%) by 2011 of copayment rates for outpatient psychiatric services under the Medicare program.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 22, 2005:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Mar 15, 2005:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Mar 3, 2005:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 3, 2005:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
