Condemns the conduct of Chief Minister Narendra Modi for condoning or inciting bigotry and intolerance against any religious group in India, including people of the Christian and Islamic faiths.

Urges the United States to: (1) condemn violations of religious freedom; and (2) assist other governments to promote freedom of religion.
