Robo COP Act: Robo Calls Off Phones - Directs the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) to revise the do-not-call registry provisions of the Telemarketing Sales Rule to prohibit politically-oriented recorded message telephone calls to listed telephone numbers.

Defines politically-oriented recorded message telephone call.
