Expresses the sense of the Senate that the Federal Trade Commission should: (1) investigate the publication of the video game "Grand Theft Auto: San Andreas" to determine if the publisher, Rockstar Games, deceived the Entertainment Software Ratings Board to avoid an "Adults Only" rating; and (2) impose the maximum penalty possible if a deception was committed.
