Summary (as of Apr 6, 2006)

Amends the Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States to suspend, through December 31, 2009, the duty on golf club driver heads of titanium, each with a rhombus shaped center face insert and a laser welded face plate, and with 10.5 degree loft.
