Summary (as of Jun 14, 2005)

Vending Machine Safety Act of 2005 - Directs the Consumer Product Safety Commission to issue a consumer product safety standard for the manufacture and installation of vending machines, particularly those using a lever or crane apparatus to dispense a product.

States that such standard may include a requirement for warning labels or signs relating to the use of such machines to prevent injuries to individuals, including children.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 1, 2005:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Commerce, Trade and Consumer Protection.
- **Jun 15, 2005:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H4556)
- **Jun 14, 2005:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 14, 2005:** Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce.
