Summary (as of Jun 20, 2005)

Securing Affordable Vocational and Collegiate Education (SAVE) Act of 2005 - Makes permanent the qualified tuition programs enacted by the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001.

Amends the Internal Revenue Code to allow a tax deduction from gross income for payments to a qualified tuition program. Limits the annual amount of such deduction to \$5,000 (\$10,000 on joint returns).
