Summary (as of May 25, 2006)

Uniform Insurance Non-Coverage Disclosure Act - Requires state-registered insurance companies to include on the front or first page of each individual policy a noncoverage disclosure box that restates in plain English all conditions, exclusions, and other limitations pertaining to coverage under that policy.

Treats violations as unfair or deceptive acts or practices under the Federal Trade Commission Act.

- **May 25, 2006:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR S5256-5257)
- **May 25, 2006:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.
