Medicare Fairness for Organ Transplant Recipients Act of 2005 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to revise the coverage under the Medicare program of immunosuppressive drugs for Medicare beneficiaries who receive an organ transplant. Repeals the requirement that Medicare paid for the transplant.
