Waives a specified requirement of rule XIII to provide for consideration of legislation to consider or dispose of any measure related to funding for transportation programs.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 29, 2006:** Pursuant to the provisions of H. Res. 897, H. Res. 400 is laid on the table.
- **Jul 29, 2005:** Rule waives clause 6(a) of rule XIII (requiring a two-thirds vote to consider a rule on the same day it is reported from the Rules Committee) against certain resolutions reported from the Rules Committee. The rule applies the waiver to any special rule reported on the legislative day of July 29, 2005, providing for consideration or disposition of any measure related to funding for transportation programs
- **Jul 29, 2005:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 109-213, by Mrs. Capito.
- **Jul 29, 2005:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 80.
- **Jul 28, 2005:** Introduced in House
