Medicare Plan Enrollment Fraud Protection Act of 2005 - Amends title XVIII (Medicare) of the Social Security Act to establish a criminal penalty for fraud in connection with enrollment under an Medicare Advantage plan or prescription drug plan.

- **Feb 6, 2006:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jan 3, 2006:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Chairman.
- **Nov 18, 2005:** Introduced in House
- **Nov 18, 2005:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
