Sets forth the rule for consideration of the bill (H.R. 250) to establish an interagency committee to coordinate Federal manufacturing research and development efforts in manufacturing, strengthen existing programs to assist manufacturing innovation and education, and expand outreach programs for small and medium-sized manufacturers.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 21, 2005:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 451, the Chair put the question on adoption of the resolution and by voice vote, announced that the noes had prevailed. Mr. Gingrey objected to the voice vote based upon the absence of a quorum and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of adoption of the resolution until later in the legislative day. The point of no quorum was considered as withdrawn.
