Amends the Uniting and Strengthening America by Providing Appropriate Tools Required to Intercept and Obstruct Terrorism (USA PATRIOT ACT) Act of 2001 to extend from December 31, 2005, to February 3, 2006, provisions of that Act and the "lone wolf" provision of the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004. (The lone wolf provision redefined "agent of a foreign power" to permit issuance of Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 (FISA) orders targeting terrorists without a showing that they are members of a terrorist group or agents of such a group or of any other foreign power.)

- **Dec 22, 2005:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Dec 22, 2005:** Committee on Judiciary discharged.
- **Dec 22, 2005:** Committee on Intelligence (Permanent) discharged.
- **Dec 22, 2005:** Mr. Sensenbrenner asked unanimous consent to discharge from committee and consider.
- **Dec 22, 2005:** Considered by unanimous consent. (consideration: CR H13178-13179)
- **Dec 22, 2005:** Passed/agreed to in House: On passage Passed without objection.(text: CR H13178)
- **Dec 22, 2005:** On passage Passed without objection. (text: CR H13178)
