Summary (as of Mar 30, 2006)

New Hampshire Wilderness Act of 2006 - Designates specified federal lands in the White Mountain National Forest area of New Hampshire as a wilderness area (which shall be known as the Wild River Wilderness) and as a component of the National Wilderness Preservation System.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 25, 2006:** Mr. Pearce moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Sep 25, 2006:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H6943-6944; text of measure as introduced: CR H6943)
- **Sep 25, 2006:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 5059.
- **Sep 25, 2006:** At the conclusion of debate, the chair put the question on the motion to suspend the rules. Ms. Bordallo objected to the vote on the grounds that a quorum was not present. Further proceedings on the motion were postponed. The point of no quorum was withdrawn.
