## Summary (as of Mar 9, 2005)

Educational Opportunity for All Act of 2005 - Amends the Internal Revenue Code to allow a refundable tax credit for qualified tuition expenses. Defines "qualified tuition expenses" as tuition required for the enrollment of the taxpayer, the taxpayer's spouse or dependents at an institution of higher learning. Limits the annual amount of such credit to \$4,000 per student.
